

**Notification relating to proposals for State of Skill Development Project in Maharashtra under Aajeevika Skills**

It may be noted that the Maharashtra State Rural Livelihoods Mission (MSRLM) would like to plan implementation of proposals for Aajeevika Skills in such a way as to enable them to support orderly implementation of the projects. In this context, MSRLM proposes to provide State commitment for projects (for the period 2013-2015) as below;

(i) MSRLM has designated the following 10 districts as intensive districts namely Nandurbar, Gondia, Osmanabad, Thane, Jalna, Ratnagiri, Solapur, Wardha, Yavatmal and Gadchiroli. MSRLM has indicated a maximum target of 2500 candidate for the period 2013-15 for all the intensive districts except Gadchiroli. In other words, total candidates in approved projects in each district shall not exceed 2500 candidate.

In case of Gadchiroli, projects have to be applied for separately under Roshni initiative and the total candidates per project shall be limited to a maximum of 200 candidates per year.

(ii) In the other 23 districts (except Mumbai and Mumbai sub urban district), designated as non-intensive districts of Maharashtra, the total candidates in approved projects in each districts shall not exceed 1500 candidates for the period 2013-15.

(iii) Apart from district-wise restrictions on number of candidates per project, all the PIAs shall need to submit or align the proposal as per the category wise limits prescribed below;

(iv) If PIAs do not get the district that they seek in the proposal due to saturation of targets, they will be given an option to choose other districts by MSRLM.

(v) It may be noted that the allotted targets may spill over beyond 2015. In case of these spill over, target achievement will be allowed up to the first quarter of 2016-17. However, it may be noted that all such spill over (i.e the target candidates who may spill over) must be registered in the year 2014-15 to be considered for such spill over.

- (vi) MSRLM shall also ensure that trade and courses shall be so implemented to ensure maximum outcomes for Aajeevika Skills programme and also to eliminate / minimize duplication of candidates across programme/PIAs.
- (vii) The proposal which have been submitted by the PIA to the Ministry at [aajeevikaskills.mord@gmail.com](mailto:aajeevikaskills.mord@gmail.com) with a copy marked to [aajeevikaskills.maharashtra@gmail.com](mailto:aajeevikaskills.maharashtra@gmail.com) before the date of this notification or intimation by MSRLM will be considered based on their initial date of application. However, such proposal needs to be modified as per the terms detailed in the notification.
- (viii) All proposals shall be appraised for approval on first come first basis.
- (ix) Only those proposals sent to the Ministry at [aajeevikaskills.mord@gmail.com](mailto:aajeevikaskills.mord@gmail.com) with a copy marked to [aajeevikaskills.maharashtra@gmail.com](mailto:aajeevikaskills.maharashtra@gmail.com) will be considered for appraisal / approval.
- (x) All proposals shall adhere to Aajeevika Skills Guidelines, September 2013 in all other aspects.
