**PROCEEDINGS OF THE MEETING OF PROJECT APPROVAL COMMITTEE  
CONSTITUTED UNDER DDU-GKY COMPONENT OF NRLM HELD ON 21.06.2017  
UNDER THE CHAIRMANSHIP OF THE WORTHY PRINCIPAL SECRETARY (RD) TO  
THE GOVT. OF HP.**

3<sup>rd</sup> meeting of the project appraisal and approval committee constituted under DDU-GKY component of NRLM was organized by the HPSRLM on 21.06.2017 under the Chairmanship of Worthy Principal Secretary (RD) to the Govt. of H.P. at 11.00 am at the Meeting Hall of the HP Secretariat, Shimla. The meeting was conveyed post completion of the phase 2<sup>nd</sup> of the Qualitative Appraisal of the DDU-GKY proposals (14 nos) and to deliberate and allocate the training target to the prospective PIA's. The details of participants who had attended the meeting are attached at (annexure-'A').

The meeting began by apprising the worthy Principal Secretary on qualitative appraisal status of 14 PIAs taken in 2<sup>nd</sup> Phase. The Principal Secretary was informed that on complete evaluation of 14 PIAs, only 7 proposals have been recommended for PAC, 3 of the proposals were not considered due to non compliance of codal formalities at MRIGS end. QA of remaining 11 PIAs was conducted wherein 7 of the PIA's were recommended for PAC (2 were rejected at QA stage while 2 other PIAs withdrew their proposals). Post briefing the Worthy Principal Secretary (RD) in this context, each of the PIA was invited to give a presentation citing their core strengths, preferential sectors, challenges and work experience substantiating their proposals' worthiness for Himachal Pradesh. The following is the brief from the discussion and deliberations held during the presentations by the PIAs:

**1. Agriculture Finance Limited.(AFC)**

- The worthy Principal Secretary raised his concerns in context to no tie ups of the PIA with the companies in tourism sector for placements of candidates.
- He gave a time frame of 10-15 days to PIA for submitting the tie-ups with the companies in relevant sector.
- In context to PAC queries regarding placement of the candidates in proposed sectors the PIA informed that they have begun the process for identification of prospective employers for relevant sectors.
- The worthy Principal Secretary emphasised that post allocation of the training target and signing of MoU the PIA should start the centre within 30 - 40 days.
- The PAC opined that a target of training 700 candidates in Security, Retail, Tourism and Electronics sectors be allotted to the PIA. The detailed sector wise and district wise segregation is attached at annexure -2

**✓ 2. Manav Vikas Evam Seva Sansthan.**

- The worthy Principal Secretary raised his concerns in context to the previous placement experience of the PIA.
- The PIA informed that they need to submit the placement tie-ups and previous placement records within 10-15 days.
- The worthy Principal Secretary emphasised that post allocation of the training target and signing of MoU the PIA should start the centre within 30-40 days.
- In addition to the above, concerns were raised in context to high attrition rate of its candidates. The worthy Principal Secretary asked the PIA representatives to specially address this concern if they are allocated a DDU-GKY training target.
- The PAC opined that a target of training 500 candidates in Retail, Tourism and IT sectors be allotted to the PIA. The detailed sector wise and district wise segregation is attached at annexure -2

**3. Nalanda.**

- The worthy Principal Secretary raised his concerns in context to the tie ups of the PIA with the companies in Health sector.

- The PIA informed that they have a placement percentage of 75% and their candidate's gets and an average CTC salary of Rs 9500.
- The PIA wanted 45-60 days for full functionality of their centre but the worthy Principal Secretary emphasized that the training sector should be operational within 30-40 days.
- The PAC opined that a target of training 700 candidates in Tourism sector be allotted to the PIA. The detailed sector wise and district wise segregation is attached at annexure -2

**4. Cardiac.**

- The worthy Principal Secretary raised his concerns in context to conduct of OJTs in Himachal due to limited numbers of hospitals in Himachal. In context to this query the PIA apprised the PAC that they intend to provide OJTs to the trained candidates in Hyderabad where they are running 22 hospitals in the city.
- The PIA apprised the PAC that they have a placement percentage of 75% and their candidate's gets and an average CTC of Rs 9500/month. However, the remuneration for the foreign placement provided by them is much higher.
- The worthy Principal Secretary specifically asked the PIA to provide impetus on foreign placements if Nalanda gets a certain training allocation.
- The worthy Principal Secretary emphasised that once allocation of the training target and signing of MoU the PIA should start the centre within 30 – 40 days.
- The PAC opined that a target of training 1400 candidates in Health sector be allotted to the PIA. The detailed sector wise and district wise segregation is attached at annexure -2

**5. Samvit Education Trust:**

- The worthy Principal Secretary raised his concerns in context to the tie ups of the PIA with the companies. He asked the PIA to submit their prospective tie ups with potential employers within 10 days.
- The worthy Principal Secretary emphasised that once allocation of the training target and signing of MoU the PIA should start the centre within 30 - 40 days.
- The PAC opined that a target of training 700 candidates in IT and Retail sector be allotted to the PIA. The detailed sector wise and district wise segregation is attached at annexure -2

**6. Power to Empower:**

- The worthy Principal Secretary raised his concerns in context to the OJTs and placement ties up of the PIA. He asked the PIA to submit their prospective tie ups with potential employers within 10 days
- The worthy Principal Secretary emphasised that once allocation of the training target and signing of MoU the PIA should start the centre within 30-40days.
- The PAC opined that a target of training 700 candidates in Tourism sector be allotted to the PIA. The detailed sector wise and district wise segregation is attached at annexure -2

**7. Disha Education Society:**

- The worthy Principal Secretary raised his concerns in context to the tie ups of the PIA with the companies and preferred locations of the training centres.
- He further emphasised that the PIA should open training centres in Chamba , Shimla and Sirmaur and asked the PIA to ensure at least 50% captive employment of the trainees trained.
- The worthy Principal Secretary asked the PIA representatives to focus more on residential courses to accommodate more candidates from far flung areas. The PIA

expressed their readiness for the same and informed that they are conducting residential courses in various states across India.

- The worthy Principal Secretary emphasised that once allocation of the training target and signing of MoU the PIA should start the centre within 30 - 40 days.
- The PAC opined that a target of training 1300 candidates in Telecom, Tourism and Iron&steel sector be allotted to the PIA. The detailed sector wise and district wise segregation is attached at annexure -2

**General Instruction:**

- The worthy Principle Secretary emphasised that the readiness in terms of DGET courses, training schedule, curriculum, placement plan and possible tie ups are to be shared with NRLM prior to start of course.
- All the PIAs are to start the training centres and begin training within 30-40 days.
- Focus should be on mass mobilization aimed at inclusion of all sections of societies. The residential trainings are welcome to meet the said aim.
- On the basis of above considerations PAC has allocated the training targets to the 7 PIAs as per attachment (annexure-'C').

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks from and to the chair.
